

# **Program Info**

Join Coralive at our project location in south-west Madagascar, in collaboration with our conservation partner RD Madagascar in Ifaty, just 50 min north of Toliara. Here, the Bay of Ranobe provides the backdrop for a unique conservation learning experience. You will explore how coastal ecosystems are interconnected, how communities depend on them for food security, and how NGOs work with locals to protect habitats, support livelihoods, and create lasting impact.

We offer a fixed 4-week program that addresses the broader reality of community-based conservation. This holistic experience combines coral and mangrove restoration, sustainable fisheries, and alternative livelihoods. Alongside local experts, you will see how NGOs collaborate with communities, experience what participation looks like, and learn what makes projects succeed or fail, while gaining a behind-the-scenes view of NGO operations.

4 weeks (up to 12 weeks), always starting at the beginning of each month







# How to get involved

## **Step 1** Create your personal Coral Profile

This helps us match you with the right program, dates and roles based on your previous experiences and level of education.

## **Step 2 Let us know your Preference**

Mention it in the profile and send an email to volunteer@coralive.org with your preferred location, start date and duration.

## Step 3 Confirm your Spot

Our team will review profiles, set up interviews and email you back with confirmation details, visa information, and pre-departure guidance.

## Step 4 Get Ready for your Adventure

Arrange your international flights to arrive on your program start date. Pack your diving gear, clothes, personal items and a whole lot of curiosity and excitement.

## Step 5 Arrive and dive right-in

Meet our representatives at the airport and transfer to basecamp. Receive your orientation, settle in, and start making an impact!

## **Your Roles and Duties**

#### **Volunteers**

- Join daily lectures and discussions on marine ecosystems, NGO operations, and community-led restoration models
- Participate in practical fieldwork such as maintaining coral nurseries, outplanting corals, and supporting mangrove planting activities
- Gain first-hand exposure to alternative livelihood projects (e.g., sea cucumber, seaweed, or oyster farming)
- Understand local perspectives and challenges
- Learn how to design, plan, and evaluate small-scale conservation projects
- Initiate and expand your global conservation network

## **Location Info**

Situated within the Bay of Ranobe, a semienclosed lagoon, housing coral reefs, mangrove forests and extensive seagrass beds, you will be based at RD Madagascar's conservation camp, located between Vezo fishing villages. Accommodation is simple but comfortable, with shared rooms and communal meals. Life here is remote and rustic, giving you a real sense of immersion in southwest Madagascar. In your free time, you can explore nearby reefs, walk along the beach to Mangily, or visit the Reniala spiny forest reserve with its baobabs and unique desert-adapted flora. On weekends or days off, you can head into Toliara to enjoy a bustling market, stock up at the supermarket, or treat yourself to ice cream in town before returning to the tranquility of camp life.










